Day 1, Wednesday April 10: Round 1 & 2 Sectional Play. 2 games of 18 ends

Day 2, Thursday April 11: Round 3 Sectional Play. 1 game of 18 ends followed by 18 end Final between the Section Winners.

1 - Entry Conditions

1.1 - Eligibility

Each Zone side to consist of 12 players. (3 Teams of 4)

Competitors representing each Zone must:

- 1.1.1 Be a NSW registered bowler
- 1.1.2 Play competition bowls for a declared club within that zone
- 1.1.3 Be aged 70 years or older on or before 1st day of competition (April 10 2024)

2 - Competition Format

The format of play will be a 2 Sections of 4 - Round Robin or determined by the Controlling Body (Zone 3) The best performed team from each section will contest a Final, to determine the Winner.

2.1 - Match Format

The format of play will be:

Fours: 3 rinks per side, 2 bowls per player, 18 ends per rink. 54 ends per side

2.2 - Re-spotting of the jack

- 2.2.1 Killed ends will have the jack re-spotted. The front of the re-spotted jack will align with the 2 metre line in the centre of the rink.
- 2.2.2 If the spot mentioned in 2.2.1 is partly or completely covered by a bowl, the jack must be placed as close as possible to the covered spot and on the centred rink line.

2.3 - Time Limits

There will be no time limits

2.4 - Late Arrival

Any player/team/side arriving after the official start time shall lose the right to play trial ends. Any side arriving at the green more than 15 minutes after the official start time shall forfeit the game. 15 shots shall be awarded to the winning team and 0 shots to the team who forfeited. All 10 points will be awarded to the winning team.

2.5 - Incomplete Matches

- 2.5.1 Where matches are unable to be completed, 45 Ends will constitute a match.
- 2.5.2 Where less than 45 ends have been played the controlling body may:
- 2.5.2.1 Declare the match drawn and equal points shall be allocated to each side
- 2.5.2.2 Elect to continue the match either to 54 ends or in entirety

2.6 - Alterations to the format and length of games

The Controlling Body reserves the right to alter the format, times of Play, greens and venues to suit local or any unforeseen circumstances, giving as much notice as possible.

2.7 - Trial Ends

2 trial ends are permitted before each Game and before the Final

2.8 - Replacement and Substitute players

- 2.8.1 Teams may be permitted to commence play with 3 players in any or all teams.
- 2.8.2 At the discretion of Controlling Body, sides may be allowed an emergency substitute player or players whose declared club does not reside within the Zone.

3 - SCORING

The method of scoring for all round robin matches shall be:

Side Win - 7 Points (Side scoring the highest aggregate number of shots)

Side Tie (Draw) - 3.5 Points (Both Sides Score equal aggregate number of shots)

Side Loss - O Point (Side scoring the lesser aggregate number of shots)

Team Win - 1 Point (one point for each team of the side that wins (rink win))

Team Tie - 0.5 Point (0.5 points for each team of the side that ties (rink win))

3.1 - Determination of Finalists

- 3.1.1 The 2 teams with the highest points in each Section after the round robin play will contest the Final.
- 3.1.2 In the event of a tie-on total points after round robin play the finalist(s) will be determined as follows:
- (i) The side with the largest difference between 'total shots for' and 'total shots against' shall be declared the winner
- (ii) If there is still a tie, the side with the lowest 'total shots against' shall be declared the winner
- (iii) If there is still a tie, the side winning the highest number of ends over all matches in Round Robin play shall be declared the winner
- (iv) If there is still a tie, the result of the individual match between the teams in question will be used to determine the finalist

3.2 - DETERMINATION OF WINNING ZONE

The winner of the Final will be determined on the overall side win only (rink wins not considered). In the event of a tie there shall be an additional 3 ends (1 end per rink) to determine the winner. If there is still a tie this is repeated until a winner is determined.

3.3 - PERPETUAL TROPHY

The current holders of the Trophy will present the Veterans Inter Zone Trophy to the Winning Zone. Should this be the same Zone then the Host Zone will present the Trophy.

4 - HEAT POLICY

In the event of a heatwave all play will be suspended once the temperature hits 36 degrees Celsius. The Controlling Body may at their discretion suspend play at a lower temperature. Number of ends in round robin play or finals may be reduced if heat may become a factor later in the day.
